Have your computer read your favorite web page, email, homework, or even read a book. There is even a program on this site that will let you convert your documents into audio files so you can listen to them on your MP3 player or iPod! These tools are also great for proofreading and editing your homework and have features that help you study more efficiently and effectively.

SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

Before you download and use Premier Literacy's tools, you will want to make sure your home computer meets the following minimum system requirements. If your system meets these requirements and you have any issues once you download and install the software, be sure to contact Premier Literacy Technical Support at 815-927-7390, Option 2.

- Microsoft Windows XP, Vista
- 512 MB of RAM recommended
- 200 MB of free disk space
- Mouse, Keyboard, Speakers
- SVGA Monitor with a minimum 800x600 DPI resolution

A scanner is only a requirement if you wish to convert hardcopy documents (i.e. books, magazines, letters) into digital text. Premier Literacy's scanning features work with virtually all Automatic Document Feed (ADF) and All-In-One scanners.

LOGIN INSTRUCTIONS

You can go to www.premierathome.com and download and install as many products as you need. The only limitation is that these programs can only be installed on computers owned by the student or parents of the student.

1. Go to www.premierathome.com. Once you get to the site, you will see a Log In screen.

2. Type in the following Username and Password and then click on the **Log In** button.

Username: dsbon

Password: enable

3. Note that the Username and Password are case sensitive, so you must correctly enter all lower-case letters exactly as they are shown above. When your login is successful, you will be at the Home page.

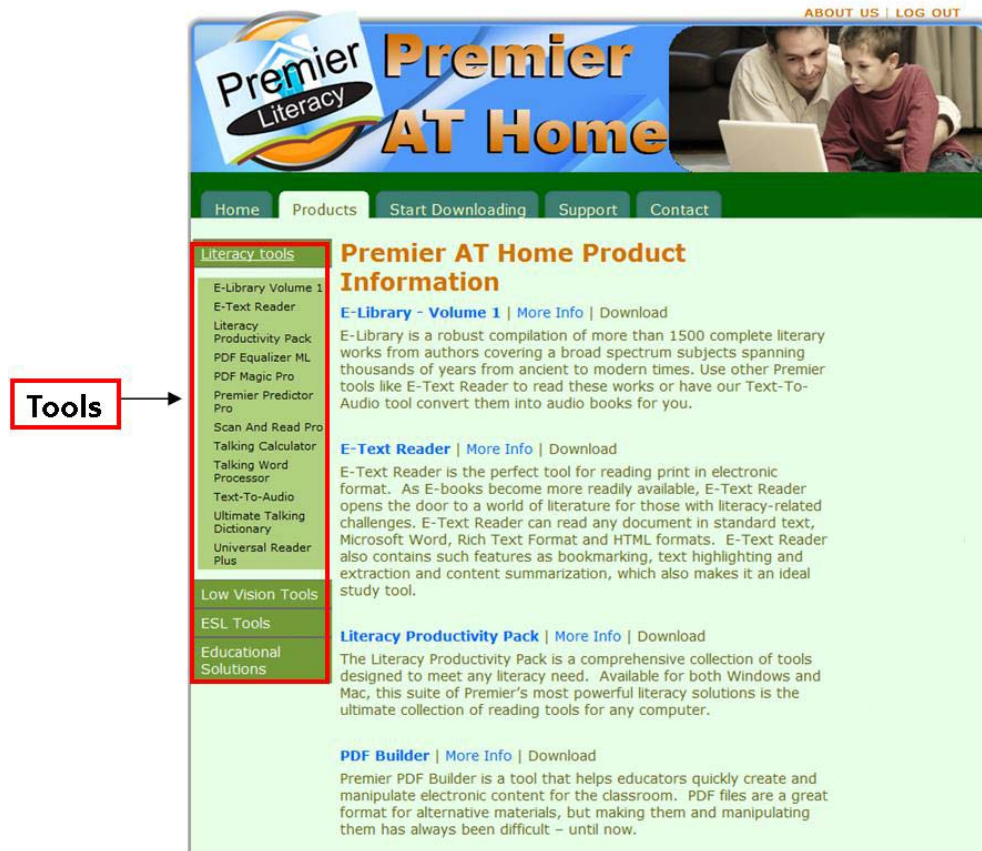



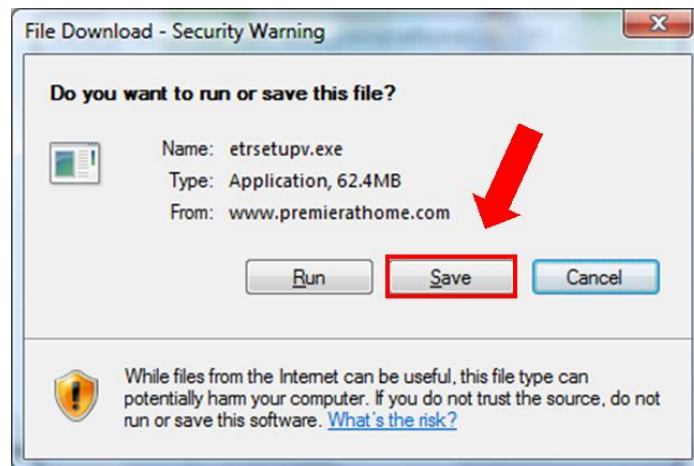
What tool should I use?

DOWNLOAD AND INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Select the tool you want to download and install by clicking on its name.



2. A window similar to the following will be displayed. Make sure you select the **Save** button. This will prompt you where you want to save the setup file on your personal computer. Make sure you make a note of the name and location where you save the file.



3. Once the file has been downloaded, go to the location where you saved the file. Double-click on the filename to launch the installation program. Follow the prompts during the installation to successfully install the tool.
